Florence Griffith Joyner, also known as Flo-Jo, was an American athlete who was born on December 21, 1959. She became famous for her excellent performances in track and field, particularly in the 1988 Olympics, where she won three gold medals and set two world records. Because of her success, she was accused of taking drugs to improve her speed, but she always denied these claims saying that she had never taken any. Even after retiring from competition, she continued to be involved in sports as a coach and mentor. Joyner was also known for her unique fashion style, which made her an inspiration for many people. She died in 1998 from epilepsy, but new generations of athletes continue to look up to her.
